On May 24, 2025, AFMR successfully organized the Capstone Project Viva for MBA 2nd semester students. The initiative, a key component of the curriculum, aimed to apply theoretical knowledge to real-world business problems.

Student teams presented research-based solutions on topics across finance, marketing, operations, and business strategy, followed by Q&A interactive sessions with faculty **Projects** members. were evaluated originality, analytical depth, application, and teamwork. Topics ranged from consumer behavior and market entry strategies to supply chain optimization and sustainability initiatives.

FDP ON BIBLIOMETRIC ANALYSIS AT AFMR

On August 6, 2025, AFMR conducted a Faculty Development Program (FDP) on Bibliometric Analysis, led by Dr. Payal Sharma, Assistant Professor, AFMR. The workshop was attended by 13 faculty members, reflecting keen interest in research-oriented tools.

The session introduced bibliometric concepts and applications in management and social science research. Participants learned how to prepare datasets from Scopus, Web of Science, and Dimensions.ai, and received hands-on training with VOSviewer, a tool for visualizing bibliometric networks. Faculty practiced creating co-authorship, co-citation, and keyword maps, gaining practical experience in data interpretation.

The FDP concluded with an open discussion, where participants clarified queries and shared reflections. Overall, the program enhanced research skills, empowering faculty to apply bibliometric techniques in their work and contribute to higher-quality academic output.
